




Calls for Service - Criminal Vs. Non-Criminal

- Consistent 5 year trends in Sudbury
 Approximately 15% of calls are criminal in nature, 17% in 2019

 Approximately 85% of calls are non criminal in nature, 82% in 2019
- This trend is consistent across the province




Total Criminal Offences – Five Year Trend Analysis

Numerous factors can contribute to fluctuations in crime statistics:

- Enforcement driven crime
- Social and economic factors
- Crime prevention strategies
- Changes in UCR coding process
- Heightened awareness
- Preventing victimization before it occurs
- Increased online reporting



Total Offences by Year






Total Criminal Offences and Clearance Rates

- 5.7% increase in criminal offences in 2019

 Large increase in Property Crime (+764 offences)
- -5.8% decrease in clearance rates in 2019




Crime Category Offences

Violent offences are up 5%*

Recent change in way criminal offences are classified nationally (UCR)

- Other Criminal Code offences are down 16.3%
- Federal Statutes are down by 23.4%
 Concentrating on higher level drug traffickers
- Property offences are up by 14%

Substantial increase in Theft Under and Fraud which accounted for 67% of total property offences.






Violent Crime Offences

- Sexual Assaults are up by 14.4%
 Increased community awareness of sexual assault and violence
- Other Sexual Offences are up by 11.9%

- Robberies have decreased 9.9%
- Criminal Harassment has increased 30.9%






Property Crime Offences

 Break and Enters over all are down by 16.6%

Increased patrols, increase use of surveillance technology by businesses


- Theft Under \$5000 are up by 24.5%
 - Challenges include: reporting after the fact and without suspects.

- Frauds are up 37%
 Increase in identity frauds and identity theft
- Mischiefs are up 8.3%



Crime Category Clearances

- Investigative standards and complexities
- Violent Crime clearance rates higher offender often known to the victim
- Federal Statutes are generally enforcement driven resulting in high clearance rates
- Property Crimes challenging to solve due to scarcity of evidence, witnesses, forensics






Road Safety – Impaired Driving Offences

- Increase of 42 impaired driving offences in 2019
 - Introduction of Bill C-46
 - Increased Training
 - Targeted RIDE programs
- Partnerships to reduce impaired driving:
 - MADD
 - Impact 6/21
 - Action Sudbury

- Last Drink Program

Crime Trends

- Overall crime has increased slightly
 - Mainly attributed to a large increase in Property Crime
- Crime only represents a small portion of policing services being delivered to the Community
- Investment in Community Safety and Well-Being
- Modernization of our service delivery model
- Collaborative work with partners
 - Sexual Assault Review
 - Rapid Mobilization Table (RMT)
 - Community Drug Strategy (CDS)
 - Violent Threat Risk Assessment (VTRA)
 - Building & Understanding Resilience & Strength Together (B.U.R.S.T.)


