2016 Budget Presentation

Chair Caldarelli reviewed the status of the budget as was presented at the November 18, 2015 meeting and asked Chief Pedersen to present reduction options that could see a net increase under 2%.

Chief Pedersen advised that the budget tabled at the November 18, 2015 Board meeting showed a necessary increase of 2.1 % depicting a zero percent growth. The budget supports service levels to deliver operations lawfully. Any reductions may alter the ability to provide adequate and effective policing to the community. The largest portion of the increase represents fixed salary costs at 1.8%. The budget was reviewed for efficiencies and several options for cost recovery were presented including an increase to Paid Duty Administration Fee, rental charges for Police space, divesting certain programs such as the Lions Eye in Sky and Citizens on Patrol, holding all reserve fund contributions for the year, and suspending projected increases in fuel costs. Further investigations into reducing costs of Storefront operations regarding leases and rents will continue. The GSPS 2016 budget is now 2.7% below cumulative provincial averages for the past seven years prior to any reductions. The Board tasked Chief Pedersen with identifying the options that would most realistically meet the target and still maintain service levels.
