


#### **Crime Trends**

- Crime prevention works




#### **Calls For Service - Five Year Trend Analysis**



- Calls for Service decreased 1.6% in 2015 from 2014
- 5 year trend calls for service down 8.2%
- Move from an Incident
   Driven Reactive Model to
   a Proactive Risk Driven
   Model
- Referrals to other agencies/service providers for non police matters




# Calls for Service Criminal versus Non-Criminal




- Consistent 5-year trends in Sudbury
  - Approximately 15% of calls are criminal in nature
  - Approximately 85% of calls are non criminal
- This trend is consistent across the Province



#### **Total Criminal Offences and Clearance Rates**






- 5.3% decrease in crime
- 3.9% increase in clearance rate




#### **Total Offences - Five Year Trend Analysis**



- Consistent with National and Provincial trends
- Numerous factors can contribute to fluctuations in crime statistics
  - Citizens not reporting crime
  - Enforcement driven crime
  - Social and economic factors
  - Age demographics
  - Crime Prevention Strategies
  - Crime Prevention through Environmental Design




## **Major Crime Category**



- Property offences are down 11.0%
  - Decline is attributed mostly to Theft from Motor Vehicles Under \$5000
- Violent offences are down 1.9%
- Other Criminal code offences are up 6.9%
  - Increase in breach of court/bail violations, child pornography
- Federal Statutes are up 2.6%




#### **Major Crime Category Clearances**



- Investigative standards and complexities
- Violent Crime clearances higher as in the majority of the incidents, the offender is known to the victim
- Federal Statutes are generally enforcement driven resulting in high clearance rates
- Property crimes difficult to solve due to lack of evidence, witnesses, forensics




#### **Property Crime Offences**



- Overall Property Offences are down 11%
- Break and Enters are down by 2.2%
  - BEAR Unit
  - NOCC Program
  - Focus on prolific offenders
- Theft of Motor vehicles are up 10.4%
- Thefts are down 21.9%
- Frauds are down 15.7%
- Mischiefs are up 17.3%
- Arsons are down 40.6%



## **Impaired Driving Offences**




- Decrease of 8.5% in 2015
- Increased Education and Enforcement
- Partnerships to reduce impaired driving

  - Last Drink Program





## **RIDE Program**



- Decrease of 3.4% vehicles checked
- Decrease of 2.1% roadside suspensions
- Decrease of 25% impaired drivers identified in RIDE
- RIDE is a year round program
- Focused on risk during holidays and the festive season
- Increase public awareness, social media and alternate modes of transportation impact on the number of vehicle stops
