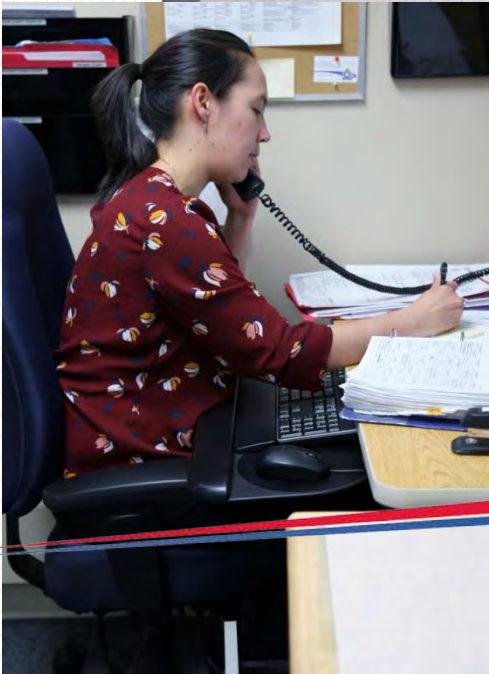
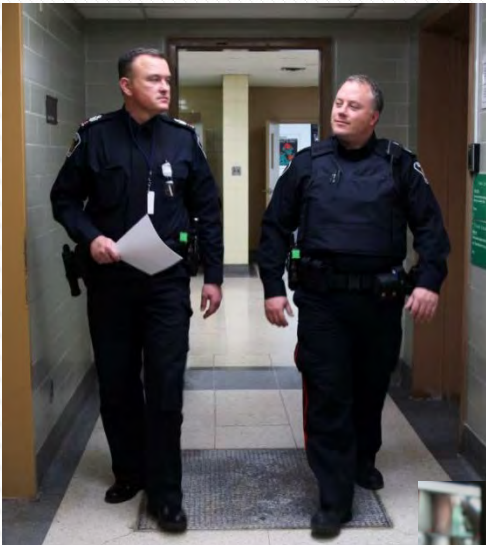

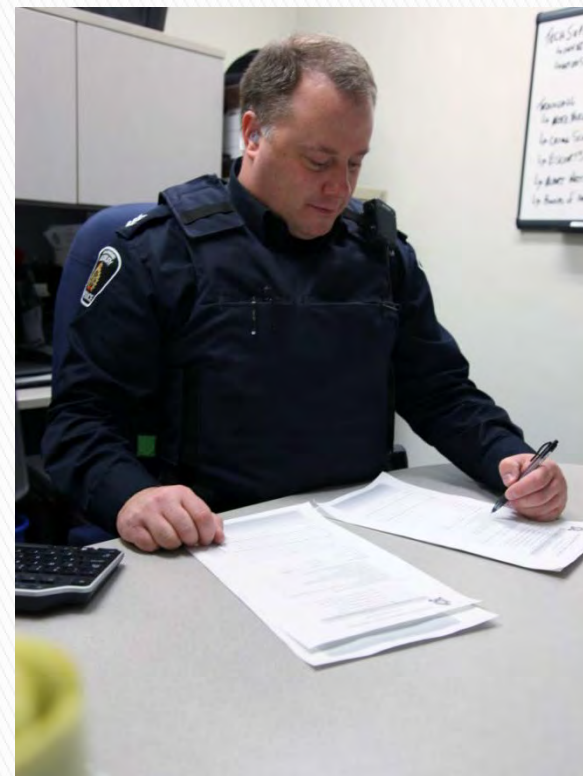

Productivity

- New W.A.S.H. Court process
- 3,898 custodies handled safely
- 3,561 Crown Briefs prepared
- 22 Warrant returns
- 1,937 Screening requests processed
- Over 4,000 summons/subpoenas served
- 558 DNA orders
- Real-time Identification Services

W.A.S.H. Court

- Weekend and Statutory Holiday (W.A.S.H.) Court
- January 2016
- 427 persons appeared
- 173 persons released
- For individuals arrested and not released by the Police
- Full bail hearing



Future of Justice



Askov Decision

- Askov 1983
- Pre trial custody– 34 months
- Pointing sawed off shotgun
- Assault with a Weapon/Extortion
- 11(b) Charter violation
- Supreme Court upheld Judge's decision –1990
- 47,000 cases in Ontario dismissed – 1991



R vs Jordan

- July 2016
- New framework established
- O.C.J. matters 18 months
- S.C.J. matters 30 months
- Improve initial disclosure
- Control measures put in place
- Crown screening requests audit
- Impact on adjournments
