Human Trafficking

- Control, force and intimidation
- Forced labour and Sexual Exploitation
- Coercion of victims
- Complex and often hidden crime
- Multi-jurisdictional crime





Who is at Risk of Being Trafficked

- Women and girls are the highest risk with Indigenous women and girls being especially vulnerable
 - Boys, men and members of the 2SLGBTQ+ community are also targeted
- Marginalized individuals within the foster care system
- Individuals who struggle with low selfesteem and low self worth and have a history of being bullied, discriminated or abused
- Individuals who struggle with addiction
- Individuals who struggle from mental health





Recognize the Signs

- Disoriented or disheveled
- Withdrawn (rarely smile)
- Victim may present to look older than they really are
- Signs of physical abuse
- Tattoos/Branding
- Not in control of their own money





Human Trafficking in Canada

2011 to 2021: 3,541 reported incidents

- 2,459 Criminal Code of Canada
- 1,082 Immigration and Refugee Protection Act

2021: 552 reported incidents

- 352 Criminal Code of Canada
- 200 Immigration and Refugee Protection Act

96% of victims are women and girls





Human Trafficking in Ontario

2011 to 2021: 2,269 reported incidents

- 1,442 Criminal Code of Canada
- 827 Immigration and Refugee Protection Act

2021: 341 reported incidents

- 182 Criminal Code of Canada
- 159 Immigration and Refugee Protection Act

Ontario's rate of human trafficking was higher than the national rate (1.4 incidents) with Ontario at 2.3





Human Trafficking in Sudbury

2020

- 61 investigations
- 12 charges
- 35 potential/identified victims

2021

- 41 investigations
- 17 charges
- 35 potential/identified victims

2022

- 93 investigations
- 29 charges
- 71 potential/identified victims



Anatomy of an Investigation

- Call for Service is received
- Human Trafficking investigator is assigned
- Sudbury and Area Victim Services engaged
- Victims are encouraged to provide a statement
- Investigators will lay charges if reasonable grounds exist that an offence has been committed

Combatting Human Trafficking

- Human Trafficking is highly under-reported and police reported cases only capture the tip of the iceberg.
- Dedicated to a survivor-centered approach
- Four key pillars; Prevention, Protection, Prosecution and Partnership
- Disclosing to police is not the final step to freedom for each Survivor, but rather, it is the beginning of a lifelong process of healing.
